Base Notes: Precious Woods and Indian Jasmine





Top Notes: Bergamot, Neroli, Ylang Ylang

Middle Notes: Hibiscus, Jasmine, Narcissus, Gardenia, Orange Blossoms

Base Notes: Musk, Wood, Dried Fruit

Top Notes: Orange Peel, Violet Leaves, Peach

Middle Notes: Lily of the Valley, Rose, Jasmine

Base Notes: Musk, Balm, Amber

WHAT IS THE OLFACTOORY PYRAMID?

To achieve a pleasant balance, fragrance notes are classified as top/head notes, body/heart notes, and base notes. These notes form the accord of a perfume, its character.

Each note reflects a perfume's volatility or the speed at which it evaporates. Due to their molecular composition, top notes evaporate more quickly, gradually giving way to heart notes and base notes.


Master perfumers use the olfactory pyramid to represent the fragrance notes of a perfume, where each ingredient is categorized according to its evaporation rate and longevity over time.



TOP NOTES

The most vivid and energetic scents are the most volatile in a perfume. These are the first aromas we smell, establishing the initial impression of a fragrance. However, they are fleeting due to their lighter, smaller molecules that evaporate more quickly.

Top notes must be carefully selected to ensure a pleasant and smooth transition to the next stage of the olfactory pyramid.




HEART NOTES

We begin to sense these as the top notes fade away.

With a less volatile molecular composition, they provide continuity to the top notes and prepare a smooth, gradual transition to the base notes.

These are the most important notes in a fragrance as they ensure the fluidity of its essences. They are therefore considered the "soul," or personality, of a perfume.

Heart or middle notes make up the largest part of a perfume. As such, they are noticeable throughout the fragrance's lifetime.



BASE NOTES

Due to their heavier molecular composition, base notes take longer to evaporate. They add depth and resonance to a fragrance, anchoring it to the skin or the environment.

As the heart notes pave the way, the base notes gradually emerge, revealing their aromas of resins, woods, sweetness, and other deep scents.
